A Public Forum with talks in English and Chinese was held after the conference in the afternoon of 30 July 2006.

Research - Pain Survey

With sponsorship from Mundipharma, PAS had conducted a survey on the prevalence of chronic pain, using a company called TNS. The data collection had started in early 2006; it had been hoped to be able to present the results at the BSM in July. However, due to problems with methodology and the way the survey was conducted, it was felt that the data was not sufficiently accurate. Several meetings have been held with TNS but to date, no satisfactory solution has been found.

Public Awareness

The Council decided to engage a PR company to help raise awareness of pain issues. Several companies were approached and Edelman was chosen. They helped to get 4 articles published in WanBao about Pain in the Elderly, Cancer Pain, Low Back Pain and Post-Surgery Pain. The resource people for these articles were council members, PAS Advisory Board members and overseas faculty for the BSM (Dr Roger Goucke). Edelman were also supposed to help launch the pain survey results but this has been shelved for the time being.

Current and Future Projects

The PAS is currently completing a booklet on pain management with Pfizer, this project has been led by Dr Tay Kwang Hui.

In May the Singapore Medical Association is organizing a conference which will revolve around pain-related topics. PAS will be one of the co-organising associations and members are asked to lend their support.
